## Thoughts on Membership

According to a Western Connecticut State University report, "Volunteering allows you to connect to your community and make it a better place. Even helping with the smallest tasks can make a real difference to the lives of people, animals, and organizations in need.

The effectiveness and strength of our Exchange Club is directly related to member involvement. The membership committee, working closely with club officers, is developing an ongoing program to stimulate the attendance and participation of current members.

The executive officers will continue their policy of running a quality Exchange Club meeting with interesting programs, following the planned agenda, and starting and ending on time. This policy is one way to boost attendance.

Good meals, service, and networking are essential to a member's continued participation. Another effective means of stimulating interest in meetings is through a well-written club newsletter, social media page, and website. updated often. The newsletter should include news on all club activities, special district and national programs, and information about members' personal and professional accomplishments.

Some of the discussions emanating from the Membership Committee are:

#### **Business connections:**

- Create a flyer to hand out at events and send to the target organizations. (e.g., businesses, nonprofits, educational and vocational institutions, medical facilities)
- Determine who is the best candidate to contact each entity
- Solicit recommendations from members on target organizations and how Exchange members can connect them. Consider developing sponsorships that will lead to partnership relations with Exchange for the benefit of the community

### **Current members engagement:**

Suggestions on how to retain members.

- Spotlight a member in the newsletter and once a month at the informational update meeting. Create a directory with information and photographs.
- Communicate the benefits of a "corporate" membership to members
- Determine why current members are absent from weekly meetings and volunteer activities (Use a mailed card. provide a survey or questionnaire, for example).

For example, when members miss three or more consecutive meetings, a friendly telephone call or email should be made to let them know they are missed and update them on club activities. Communication will emphasize each member's importance and let them know they are essential to the club's continued success.

#### **Create a Mentor Program:**

- The Membership committee will facilitate the mentor appointment for each new member.
- Create expectations of the mentor.

## **Community Engagement:**

- Community engagement committee—The committee leaders will work to establish a program to educate the community on the Exchange Club and how they can obtain membership or partnership. All members and prospective members should know the Exchange value statements:
- VISION: A strong America, safe communities, and unified people.
- MISSION: Exchange, inspiring communities to become better places to live.
- CORE VALUES: Family, Community, and Country
- MOTTO: Unity for Service
